**'Ordinance and General Rules of B.A.LL.B. Five Year (Ten-Semester) Degree Course'**

In the reference of letter issued by the University Grants Commission, New Delhi vide letter No. F.2- 10/2023(AC-Policy) dated 09.09.2024, in compliance and consequences of that, the Executive Council of Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Awadh University, Ayodhya has decided and permitted the college vide letter no. लो.अ.वि. /सम्ब0/23727/2024 दिनांक 08.10.2024 to run the session as per the provisions for higher education of a University Grant Commission under the autonomous status.

Whereas, it is essential to adopt and implement the curriculum and rules formulated and approved by the Bar Council of India for legal education.

Whereas, this ordinance shall be implemented and enforced from the session 2025-26.

**1. Short title, Application, and Commencement.-**

- (1) This ordinance shall be called '**T.R.C. LAW COLLEGE, BARABANKI (Standard of Admission and Procedure for Award of Bachelor of Laws (B.A.LL.B.) Integrated Double Degree Ordinance, 2025**'.
- (2) It shall apply to Professional Courses- B.A.LL.B. (Five Years) of the T.R.C. LAW COLLEGE, SATRIKH, BARABANKI.
- (3) It shall come into force from the date of the \_\_\_\_\_

**2. Definitions-**


"Bar Council of India or Council or BCI" shall means Bar Council of India constituted under the Act 1961.

"Integrated Double Degree Course" shall mean the B.A.LL.B. (Five-Year) Program.

"Bachelor Degree in Law" means and includes a degree in law conferred by the Institute/University after successful completion of Senior Secondary School course ('+2') or equivalent (such as 11+1, "A" level in Senior School Leaving certificate course) from a recognized University of India or outside or from a Senior Secondary Board or equivalent, constituted or recognized by the Union or by a State Government or from any equivalent institution from a foreign country recognized by the government of that country for the purpose of issue of qualifying certificate on successful completion of the course, may apply for and be admitted into the with a degree in any other subject as the first degree from the University whose such a degree in law is recognized by the Bar Council of India for the purpose of enrolment.

Provided that applicants who have obtained +2 Higher Secondary Pass Certificate or First Degree Certificate after prosecuting studies in distance or correspondence method shall also be considered as eligible for admission in the integrated Five Years course.



**"CLE- Center of Legal Education"** means in this Ordinance, all College or Institute affiliated and Bachelor of laws degree conferred by this University. 

**"Compulsory subjects" and "Compulsory Clinical Subject"** means and include subjects prescribed by the Bar Council of India as such *prescribed by the Bar Council of India Rules of Legal Education, 2008 Schedule II Part II' for the B.A. LL.B. Five Year Course.*

**"Notify and Notification"** means notifying on the website of the college i.e. T.R.C. Law College, Satrikh, Barabanki. ([www.trclc.org](http://www.trclc.org)).

**"Principal"** means in this Ordinance, the ex officio Principal of the CLE (Center of Legal Education)

**"Rules"** means on 'Rules of Legal Education, 2008'.

**"Regulation"** means UGC regulations had been issued and from time to time will be issued.

**"University"** means as defined under the University Grants Commission Act, 1956 including National Law Universities and other Universities established by Acts of Central or State and also institutions declared as Deemed to be University under Section 3 of the University Grants Commission Act.

**"Affiliating University"** shall stands for Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Avadh University, Ayodhya.

### **3. The Integrated Double Degree of Bachelor of Laws (B.A.LL.B.)**

T.R.C. LAW COLLEGE, SATRIKH, BARABANKI (Affiliated- Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Awadh University, Ayodhya) may confer the Degree of Bachelor of laws on such candidates who, being eligible for the admission in the B.A.LL.B. Degree Course, have received regular instruction in the prescribed courses of study, undergone required practical training, passed relevant examination and being otherwise suitable by virtue of their character, have fulfilled such other conditions as may be laid down from time to time.

### **4. General Rules Regarding Admission-**

- a) The admission to B.A.LL.B. (Five Years Program) shall be regulated either on merit basis or through an Entrance test conducted by the college.
- b) The admission to B.A.LL.B. First Semester shall be taken as per the rules prescribed by Bar Council of India. Accordingly, only those candidates shall be admitted who have obtained not less than 45% marks for General, 42% marks for OBC, and 40% for SC/ST in the 10+2 or any other equivalent examination and such other conditions and eligibility by the Bar Council of India from time to time.
- c) An applicant, who has passed +2 examination from any recognized board or any equivalent course, may apply for a five year degree programme in law leading to conferment of B.A.LL.B. Degree on successful completion of the regular programme conducted by the autonomous college. The B.A.LL.B.



Programme is a Five year full time course and no student shall be allowed to simultaneously register for a law degree programme with any other graduate or post graduate course run by the same or any other university.

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- d) The applicants who have obtained graduation/post-graduation through open universities system directly without having any basic qualification for prosecuting such studies are not eligible for admission in the course.

Relaxation of up to 5% will be granted to SC/ST candidates; 3% relaxation will be granted to OBC, on certificate issued by appropriate authority as per the prescribed procedure and rules time to time.

Provided that such a minimum qualifying marks shall not automatically entitle a person to get admission into an CLE but only shall entitle the person concerned to fulfill other institutional/ University, criteria notified by the University /BCI/ Appropriate government from time to time for admission purpose.

### **5. The Curriculum and Duration of the Programme-**

- i) The curriculum of study of the B.A.LL.B. Degree shall comprise of the courses set out in Schedule A.
- ii) The course content of each paper of study shall be such as set out in Schedule B.
- iii) Provided that the Board of Studies may make such changes in the contents of the course of study as and when it deems necessary, and report the matter to the Academic Council.
- iv) The curriculum of study for the B.A.LL.B. (Five year Program) shall be spread over in Five Academic years, and shall be divided into Ten semesters for the examination purposes called as First, Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth, Sixth, Seventh, Eight, Nine, and Tenth semester. Each Academic year shall be divided into two semesters.
- v) B.A.LL.B. Programme shall be for a minimum duration of Five (5) years, and a maximum duration of Ten (10) years from the date of admission to the Law programme.
- vi) Each semester course shall be conducted in not less than 15 weeks with not less than 30 class-hours per week including tutorials, moot court, seminar, workshops and special lectures, provided that there shall be at least 24 lecture hours per week as prescribed by the Bar Council of India.
- vii) The medium of instruction and examination shall be either English or Hindi.

### **6. Semester System & Standard of Courses-**

- (a) Whereas the outline of the minimum number of law courses both theoretical and practical, compulsory and optional, as the case may be, prescribed by the Bar Council of India and specified in the Schedule II of the 'BCI Rules' (See Annexure-I) the shall be followed by the Curriculum Design Committee/ Board of Studies.



- (b) There would be a regular and proper evaluation of semester system for the purpose of certification of the students graduating in law-Bachelor of Laws (B.A.LL.B. Five year) after completing the course as a regular student. The Principal (Controller of the Examination) will submit a result to the Competent Authority of the University, the copies of the curriculum designed and developed in the course of study, rules of academic discipline and the examination and evaluation and also the amendments to those as and when so amended, for necessary action approval and notification will be submitted to the Academic Council.
- (c) The course leading to degree in law, shall be conducted in semester system including tutorials, moot room exercise, court visits & participations in Lok Adalat, free legal aid camps and seminars etc.

#### 7. Course of Study-

A candidate for the Five year B.A.LL.B. Degree course shall be required—

- i) To study six papers in each semester including clinical papers and must pass in all papers with minimum of 36% marks in each paper and 45% marks in aggregate in each semester in order to qualify for B.A.LL.B. Degree.
- ii) To study Fifty Five (55) compulsory theory papers including twenty one (21) humanities subject theory papers, Four (04) optional theory papers out of Twelve (12) optional theory papers from the allotted Groups (Group-I & Group-II) in Ninth and Tenth Semester, and one paper of Legal Language-English (100Marks), carrying 100 marks for each paper through written examination conducted by the college. See 'as prescribed by the Bar Council of India Rules of Legal Education, 2008 Schedule II Part II' for the LL.B. Three Year Course'.
- iii) For the allotment of optional papers it will be mandatory that minimum 30 % percent of total students of that semester should opted the same optional papers, otherwise the student has to opt other optional papers.
- iv) To study four compulsory clinical papers as prescribed in VIII to X semesters carrying 100 marks for each paper through Project work/Practical work and Viva-voce conducted by the College as prescribed by the Bar Council of India.
- v) Center of Legal Education (CLE) shall establish and run a legal Aid Clinic with the help of final year students and in co- operation with the Legal Aid Authorities.
- vi) Papers in B.A.LL.B. Five Year Course shall be Consist Fifty Five (55) papers including Twenty One (21) Humanities Subject papers and four (04) Clinical compulsory subject and Four (04) Papers from optional group 'as prescribed by the Bar Council of India Rules of Legal Education, 2008 Schedule II Part II' for the LL.B. Three Year Course'. As annexed here in after Annexure B- Scheme of Papers. The Contents of the Law papers/subject for B.A.LL.B. Degree Course shall be as Annexure- C of this Ordinance.

### Examination

- vii) Any regular student who fails to secure 75% attendance in each paper will not be allowed to appear in examination. The aforesaid attendance requirement may be reduced up to 65% on recommendation of the Principal, on health ground or for any other reasonable cause.
- viii) There shall be an examination at the end of each semester. Every student registered in any semester shall be eligible to appear in the concerned examination of the respective semester, subject to the attendance requirement as prescribed by the Bar Council of India and the College/ University. It shall be calculated on the semester basis.
- ix) The Candidate(s) for the Five year degree course (Bachelor of Laws) shall be required to pass in all the prescribed courses within the span of ten years from the academic session of his/her admission in First Semester.
- x) A candidate shall be examined in 'Fifty Five (55) compulsory (including one 'Legal Language- Hindi & English')' & 'Four (04) optional theory papers' from first to ten semester carrying 100 marks for each paper through written examination duration of three hours conducted by the Institute.
- xi) The 'Four (4) Compulsory Clinical Paper' shall be examined as prescribed in contents of papers.
- xii) A Student must pass in all Fifty Five (55) Papers and in Legal Language- English with a minimum of 36% marks in each and 45 in aggregate in each semester in order to qualify for the B.A.LL.B. Degree.
- xiii) A student who appeared in the Ist Semester Examination shall be automatically promoted to II<sup>nd</sup> Semester, Similarly III<sup>rd</sup> to IV<sup>th</sup>, V<sup>th</sup> to VI<sup>th</sup>, VII<sup>th</sup> to VIII<sup>th</sup>, and IX<sup>th</sup> to X<sup>th</sup> Semester. He will be allowed to appear as a back student according to para VIII<sup>th</sup> to XI<sup>th</sup> of Entitled to Promotion under Point 7, Rules of Promotion, Back Papers and Improvement.
- xiv) There shall be an examination at the end of each semester.
- xv) There shall be a viva-voce examination in Four practical/clinical papers including the 'Professional ethics & Professional Accounting System' which will be divided into sixty + forty respectively written & viva-voce examination.
- xvi) A student has to qualify both theory and practical examination.
- xvii) A student who obtained 45% marks but less than 60% marks will be placed in 2<sup>nd</sup> (Second) division and those who obtain 60% and above will be placed in 1<sup>st</sup> (First) division



### Rules of Promotion, Back Papers and Improvement.

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For promotion to the Next Semester/Year, the students appearing in Semester Examination are categorized as in followings:-

- xviii) The candidate(s), who have taken admission in B.A.LL.B. First Semester in a session can be put in the following two categories on the basis of their attendance in the session. (i) Those who put the required minimum percentage of attendance for appearing in the First Semester Examination and filled in examination form in time for appearing in the first semester examination ; (ii) Those who do not put the required minimum percentage of attendance for appearing in the First Semester Examination or do not filled in examination form in time for appearing in the first semester examination;

The candidates under category (i) are eligible for appearing in the examination of Part I, while candidates under category (ii) are not eligible to appear in the examination of semester.

Further candidates of category (ii) are not eligible for re-admission. The admission of those candidates will stand cancel.

- xix) After appearing in the Examination of First semester the candidates can be put in the following Categories in the context of declaration of result of first Semester Examination.

- (a) **Passed** i.e. who have passed in all items of the examination of the semester;  
(b) **Promoted** i.e. who have not passed in all the items of the examination of semester.

- ii) The candidate(s), who have appeared in B.A. LL.B. First Semester Examination in a session shall be promoted in the B.A.LL.B. Second Semester allowed to appear in examination subject to condition above mentioned rule relating the attendance and fill up the in time examination form.

- iii) Declaration of result after second Semester- After declaration of results of First & Second Semesters a candidates to participate in college Examination the Student(s) and similarly the onward i.e. third, fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh, Eighth, Ninth, and Tenth as mention here in after, are categorized as in followings:-

- a) **Passed** i.e. who have passed in all items of the examination of the semester.  
b) **Entitled to Promotion 'EP'**  
c) **Eligible to Promotion on Back Paper 'EPBP'**  
d) **No Promotion, 'NP'**

#### Entitled to Promotion (EP)

A student(s) of First and Second semester shall be promoted in Third semester if he/she has passed the First and Second; and a student(s) has passed the First, Second, Third and Fourth Semesters shall be promoted in the Fifth Semester; and a student(s) has passed the First, Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth and Sixth Semesters shall be promoted in the Seventh Semester; and a student(s) has passed the First, Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth, Sixth, Seventh, and Eight Semesters shall be promoted in the Ninth Semester.

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- ii) A Student(s) of First Semester and appeared in the College's Examination shall be promoted in the Second Semester; and a student(s) who enrolled in third semester and appeared in the college examination shall be promoted in the Fourth Semester; and a student(s) who enrolled in Fifth Semester and appeared in the college examination shall be promoted in the Sixth Semester; and a student(s) who enrolled in the Seventh Semester and appeared in the college's examination shall be promoted in the Eighth Semester; and student(s) who enrolled in the Ninth Semester and appeared in the college's examination shall be promoted to the Tenth Semester.
- iii) A student of first and second semester shall be promoted in third semester if he/she has secured 36% marks in each paper and 45% marks in aggregate in each semester.
- iv) Similarly a student of Third and Fourth semester shall be promoted in Fifth semester if he/she has secured 36% marks in each paper and 45% marks in aggregate in each semester and has been cleared and passed the First and Second Semesters exams.
- v) Similarly a student of Fifth and Sixth semester shall be promoted in Seventh semester if he/she has secured 36% marks in each paper and 45% marks in aggregate in each semester and has been cleared and passed the First, Second, Third, and Fourth Semesters exams.
- vi) Similarly a student of Seventh and Eighth semester shall be promoted in Ninth semester if he/she has secured 36% marks in each paper and 45% marks in aggregate in each semester and has been cleared and passed the First, Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth, Sixth Semesters exams.

**Eligible to Promotion on Back Paper 'EPBP'**

- vii) the student(s) who has secured minimum mark 36% in each paper, but failed to secure aggregate of 45% would be allowed to appear in back paper examination held in the next year in accordance with Para -viii, ix, x, xi, & xii.
- viii) the student(s) would be Eligible to Promotion on Back Paper 'EPBP' in the Third Semester, if he/she secured the 45% marks in minimum seven papers of First and Second semesters exams; allowed to appear in back paper examination.
- ix) the student(s) would be Eligible to Promotion on Back Paper 'EPBP' in the Fifth Semester, if he/she secured the 45% marks in minimum seven papers of Third & Fourth semesters exams and had been cleared the First & Second semesters exams; allowed to appear in back paper examination.
- x) the student(s) would be Eligible to Promotion on Back Paper 'EPBP' in the Seventh Semester, if he/she secured the 45% marks in minimum seven papers of Fifth & Sixth semesters exams and had been cleared the First, Second, Third, Fourth semesters exams; allowed to appear in back paper examination.
- xi) the student(s) would be Eligible to Promotion on Back Paper 'EPBP' in the Ninth Semester, if he/she secured the 45% marks in minimum seven papers of Seventh and Eighth semesters exams and had been cleared the First, Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth, Sixth semesters exams; allowed to appear in back paper examination.



- xii) A student who has failed/Absent in semester exam shall be eligible to appear in back paper examination.

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#### **No Promotion 'NP'**

- xiii) No Promotion, 'NP' - No student(s) shall be promoted to next semester if he/she has been detained from the examination for shortage of attendance.
- xiv) No Promotion, 'NP' - A student(s) he /she, who has not appeared or failed to appeared in the Semesters Exam-First, Third, Fifth, Seventh, Ninth shall not be promoted in Second, Fourth, Sixth, Eighth, & Tenth Semesters respectively.
- xv) No Promotion, 'NP' - A student(s) would not be promoted in Fifth Semester, if he/she, has not passed the Semesters Exam-First and Second both.
- xvi) No Promotion, 'NP' - A student(s) would not be promoted in Seventh Semester, if he/she, has not passed the Semesters Exam-First, Second, Third and Fourth Semester.
- xvii) No Promotion, 'NP' - A student(s) would not be promoted in Ninth Semester, if he/she, has not passed the Semesters Exam-First, Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth and Sixth Semester.
- xviii) Improvement examination of B.A.LL.B. I to X semester will be held as per the rules provided the college.

#### **8. Re-admission Rules**

- a. There shall be no re-admission in the B.A.LL.B. First, Third, Fifth, Seventh, and Ninth semester.
- b. A student who has failed in examination or failed to appear in the examination and who is otherwise eligible to appear in the examination as an ex-student shall not be admitted as a regular student.

9. **Overriding Effect:** The relevant UGC/BCI Rules (as amended from time to time) shall be binding on the College. All disputes regarding interpretation of provisions of this Ordinance shall be referred to 'Examination Committee of College', whose decision shall be final.

In context to above '*the Committee*' shall be constituted with Principal of the Institute, Head/Incharge of Law Department and a Senior Faculty member of the college.

#### **10. Miscellaneous Provisions**

- a. The rules contained herein the 'Ordinance' shall be deemed to have come into effect from the academic session 2025-2026 to the extent of its applicability.
- b. Any provision contained in earlier ordinances in this regard repugnant to the present ordinances shall stand repealed.
- c. Nothing in this ordinance shall be deemed or affect the inherent powers of the Principal of the Institute to make such orders, circulars as may be necessary to give the effect of regularize the academic sessions or in the interest of the Institute.

**Course outline of the Legal Education prescribed by the Bar Council of India for  
Bachelor Degree in Law (B.A. LL.B. 5-year)**

**Compulsory subjects in legal education component in both the streams (Paper 1 to 20)**  
Institute/Center of Legal Education is free to design any subject in one or more than one papers where more papers are not stipulated:

1. Jurisprudence (Legal method, Indian legal system, and basic theory of law).
2. Law of Contract
3. Special Contract
4. Law of Tort including MV Accident and Consumer Protection Laws
5. & 6. Family Law (2 papers)

19. & 20. Labour and Industrial Law (2 papers)

**Part II (B) Compulsory Clinical Courses (Papers 21 to 24 as following):**

**21. Drafting, Pleading and Conveyance Outline of the course:**

- (a) Drafting: -General principles of drafting and relevant substantive rules shall be taught
- (b) Pleadings: (i) Civil: Complaint, Written Statement, Interlocutory Application, Original



Petition, Affidavit, Execution Petition, Memorandum of Appeal and Revision, Petition under Article 226 and 32 of the Constitution of India.

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- (ii) Criminal: Complaint, Criminal Miscellaneous petition, Bail Application, Memorandum of Appeal and Revision.
  - (iii) Conveyance: Sale Deed, Mortgage Deed, Lease Deed, Gift Deed, Promissory Note, Power of Attorney, Will, Trust Deed
  - (iv) Drafting of writ petition and PIL petition the course will be taught class instructions and simulation exercises, preferably with assistance of practicing lawyers/retired judges. Apart from teaching the relevant provisions of law, the course may include not less than 15 practical exercises in drafting carrying a total of 45 marks (3 marks for each) and 15 exercises in Conveyancing carrying another 45 marks (3 marks for each exercise) remaining 10 marks will be given for viva voce.
22. Professional Ethics & Professional Accounting system Outline of the course: Professional Ethics, Accountancy for Lawyers and Bar-Bench Relations This course will be taught in association with practicing lawyers on the basis of the following materials. (i) Mr. Krishnamurthy Iyer's book on "Advocacy" (ii) The Contempt Law and Practice (iii) The Bar Council Code of Ethics (iv) 50 selected opinions of the Disciplinary Committees of Bar Councils and 10 major judgments of the Supreme Court on the subject (v) Other reading materials as may be prescribed by the University Examination rules of the University shall include assessment through case-study, viva, and periodical problem solution besides the written tests.

**23. Alternate Dispute Resolution:**

Outline of the course:

- (i) Negotiation skills to be learned with simulated program
- (j) Conciliation skills
- (k) Arbitration Law and Practice including International arbitration and Arbitration rules.

The course is required to be conducted by senior legal practitioners through simulation and case studies. Evaluation may also be conducted in practical exercises at least for a significant part of evaluation.

**24. Moot court exercise and Internship:**

This paper may have three components of 30 marks each and a viva for 10 marks.

- (a) Moot Court (30 Marks). Every student may be required to do at least three moot courts in a year with 10 marks for each. The moot court work will be on assigned problem and it will be evaluated for 5 marks for written submissions and 5 marks for oral advocacy.
- (b) Observance of Trial in two cases, one Civil and one Criminal (30 marks): Students may be required to attend two trials in the course of the last two or three years of LL.B. studies. They will maintain a record and enter the various steps observed during their attendance on different days in the court assignment. This scheme will carry 30 marks.

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- (c) Interviewing techniques and Pre-trial preparations and Internship diary (30 marks):  
Each student will observe two interviewing sessions of clients at the Lawyer's Office/Legal Aid Office and record the proceedings in a diary, which will carry 15 marks. Each student will further observe the preparation of documents and court papers by the Advocate and the procedure for the filing of the suit/petition. This will be recorded in the diary, which will carry 15 marks.
- (d) The fourth component of this paper will be Viva Voce examination on all the above three aspects. This will carry 10 marks.

## Law -Five-Year Course: B.A.LL.B. Program

### Regulations

1. For admission to the first semester of the B.A.LL.B. (Five-Year Course), the minimum qualification required for the candidate is to pass the 10 + 2 or an equivalent examination recognized by any educational institution/board operated by the central or state government with a minimum of 45% marks for General, 42% marks for OBC\* (As per the Gazette of India REGD.NO.D.L.33004/99 DATED 07.08.2014 PART III SECTION 4, NO.233), 40% marks for SC/ST respectively.
2. There is no age limit criterion for the admission in the B.A.LL.B. Program. The Candidate must pass the 10+2 examination with the minimum percentage of prescribed category mentioned in point No-1.
3. There shall be semester system for the examination as per the Rules of Legal Education, 2008 provided by the Bar Council of India. Therefore, there will be two semester examinations conducted by the autonomous college for each year. Accordingly, the entire five-year course will be divided into ten semesters. It is mandatory to obtain a minimum of 36% marks in every examination papers of each semester; however, students will only be considered to have passed if their total marks across all question papers in each semester add up to 45%.
4. All students enrolled in the first semester will be automatically promoted to the second semester. However, admission to the third semester will only be granted if they have passed both the first and second semesters or have obtained at least 45 % (percent) marks in seven (07) out of a total of twelve question papers from the first and second semesters. Students participating in the third semester examination will be automatically promoted to the fourth semester.
5. For admission to the fifth semester, it will be necessary for the student to have completely passed the examinations of first and second semester and in the condition of incomplete result in third and fourth semester it is compulsory to have obtained at least 45 percent marks in Seven (07) out of a total of twelve question papers in the third





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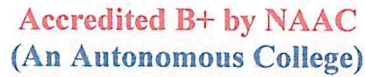
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and fourth semester. Students appearing for the fifth semester examination will be automatically promoted to the sixth semester.

6. For admission to the seventh semester, it will be required that the student has passed the examinations of the First, Second, Third, and Fourth Semester without any back-paper, and if the result is incomplete due to any reason in fifth and sixth semesters but has obtained at least 45 percent marks in seven (07) out of a total twelve question papers would be promoted to seventh semester. Students participating in the seventh semester will be automatically promoted to the eighth semester.
7. For admission to the ninth semester, it will be required that the student has passed the examinations of the first, second, third, fourth, fifth, and sixth semesters with out any back papers. And if the result is incomplete due to any reason in seventh and eighth semesters but has obtained at least 45 percent marks in seven (07) question papers out of a total twelve question papers in the seventh and eighth semester. Students appearing for the ninth semester will be automatically promoted to the tenth semester, and a student will be eligible to receive the degree of B.A.LL.B. (Five-Year Course) only after passing the examinations of all previous semesters, including the tenth semester.
8. Student who passes all ten semesters will be awarded the B.A. LL.B. degree by affiliating University.
9. Students who do not have a total of 45 percent marks in all question papers of any semester will be required to reappear for those papers in which they have obtained less than 36 percent marks to pass the exam. However, if they wish, they can also reappear in those papers in which they have obtained more than 36 percent marks to achieve a total of 45 percent. Such re-examinations will be conducted along with the main semester examinations organized by the autonomous college. Students participating in re-examinations must submit an examination application form to the autonomous college after payment of the fee prescribed by the college.
10. The minimum marks for second division will be 45 % (percent), and for first division, it will be 60 % (percent).





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
