'Ordinance and General Rules of LL.B. Three Year (Six-Semester) Degree Course'

In the reference of letter issued by the University Grants Commission, New Delhi vide letter No. F.2- 10/2023(AC-Policy) dated 09.09.2024, in compliance and consequences of that, the Executive Council of Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Awadh University, Ayodhya has decided and permitted the college vide letter no. लो.अ.वि. /सम्ब0/23727/2024 दिनांक 08.10.2024 to run the session as per the provisions for higher education of a University Grant Commission under the autonomous status.

Whereas, it is essential to adopt and implement the curriculum and rules formulated and approved by the Bar Council of India for legal education.

Whereas, this ordinance shall be implemented and enforced from the session 2025-26.

1.Short title, Application, and Commencement.-

- (1) This ordinance shall be called '**T.R.C. LAW COLLEGE, BARABANKI (Standard of Admission and Procedure for Award of Bachelor of Laws (LL.B.) Degree Ordinance, 2025**'.
- (2) It shall apply to Professional Course- LL.B. (Three Years) of the T.R.C. LAW COLLEGE, SATRIKH, BARABANKI.
- (3) It shall come into force from the date _____.

2. Definitions-

"**Bar Council of India or Council or BCI**" shall means Bar Council of India constituted under the Advocates Act 1961.

"**Bachelor Degree in Law**" means and includes a degree in law conferred by the Institute/University after any bachelor degree in science, arts, commerce, engineering, medicine, or any other discipline of a University for a period of study not less than three years.

"**CLE- Center of Legal Education**" means in this Ordinance, all College or Institute affiliated and Bachelor of laws degree conferred by this University.

"**Compulsory subjects**" and "**Compulsory Clinical Subject**" means and include subjects prescribed by the Bar Council of India as such prescribed by the Bar Council of India Rules of Legal Education, 2008 Schedule II Part II' for the LL.B. Three Year Course.

“Foreign University” means and includes any University not constituted under any Act of Parliament of India or any State Legislature in India and which is incorporated outside India under the law of that country and function as University for organizing, running and managing courses of study and confer degree on successful completion of the course.

“Notify and Notification” means notifying on the website of the College i.e. T.R.C. Law College, Satrikh, Barabanki. (www.trclc.org)

“Principal” means in this Ordinance, the ex-officio Principal of the CLE (Center of Legal Education)

“Rules” means on ‘Rules of Legal Education, 2008’.

“Regulation” means UGC and BCI regulations had been issued and from time to time will be issued.

“University” means as defined under the University Grants Commission Act, 1956 including National Law Universities and other Universities established by Acts of Central or State and also institutions declared as Deemed to be University under Section 3 of the University Grants Commission Act.

“Affiliating University” shall stands for Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Avadh University, Ayodhya.

3. The Degree of Bachelor of Laws

T.R.C. LAW COLLEGE, SATRIKH, BARABANKI (Affiliated to Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Awadh University, Ayodhya) may confer the Degree of Bachelor of laws on such candidates who, being eligible for the admission in the LL.B. Degree Course, have received regular instruction in the prescribed courses of study, undergone required practical training, passed relevant examination and being otherwise suitable by virtue of their character, have fulfilled such other conditions as may be laid down from time to time.

4. General Rules Regarding Admission-

- i) The admission to LL.B. Three Year (Six-Semester) Degree shall be regulated either on merit basis or through an Entrance test conducted by the college.
- ii) The admission to LL.B. First Semester shall be taken as per the rules prescribed by Bar Council of India. Accordingly, only those candidates shall be admitted who have obtained not less than 45% marks for General, 42% marks for OBC, and 40% for SC/ST in the qualifying examination and such other conditions and eligibility by the Bar Council of India from time to time.
- iii) An applicant who passed graduation in any discipline of knowledge from the University established by an Act of Parliament or by a State Legislature or an equivalent national institution recognized as a deemed to be university or foreign university recognized as equivalent to the status of an Indian University by an authority competent to declare equivalent, may apply for a three year degree

programme in law leading to conferment of LL.B. degree on successful completion of the regular programme conducted by a college.

- iv) The LL.B. programme is a three year full time course and no student shall be allowed to simultaneously register for a law degree programme with any other graduate or post graduate course run by the same or any other university.
- v) The applicant who have obtained graduation through open universities system directly without having any basic qualification for prosecuting such studies are not eligible for admission in the course.

Relaxation of up to 5% will be granted to SC/ST candidates; 3% relaxation will be granted to OBC, on certificate issued by appropriate authority as per the prescribed procedure and rules time to time.

Provided that such a minimum qualifying marks shall not automatically entitle a person to get admission into an CLE but only shall entitle the person concerned to fulfill other institutional/ University, criteria notified by the University /BCI/ Appropriate government concerned from time to time to apply for admission.

5. The Curriculum and Duration of the Programme-

- i) The curriculum of study of the LL.B. Degree shall comprise of the courses set out in Schedule A.
- ii) The course content of each paper of study shall be such as set out in Schedule B.
- iii) Provided that the Board of Studies may make such changes in the contents of the course of study as and when it deems necessary, and report the matter to the Academic Council.
- iv) The curriculum of study for the LL.B. three year Degree course shall be spread over in three Academic years, and shall be divided into six semesters for the examination purposes called as First, Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth and Sixth semester. Each Academic year shall be divided into two semesters.
- v) LL.B. Programme shall be for a minimum duration of three (3) years, and a maximum duration of six (6) years from the date of admission to the Law programme at CLE.
- vi) Each semester course shall be conducted in not less than 15 weeks with not less than 30 class-hours per week including tutorials, moot court, seminar, workshops and special lectures provided there shall be at least 24 lecture hours per week as prescribed by the Bar Council of India.
- vii) The medium of instruction and examination shall be either English or Hindi.

6. Semester System & Standard of Courses-

- i. Whereas the outline of the minimum number of law courses both theoretical and practical, compulsory and optional, as the case may be, prescribed by the Bar Council of India and specified in the Schedule II of the 'BCI Rules' (See Annexure-I) the shall be followed by the Curriculum Design Committee/ Board of Studies.
- ii. There would be a regular and proper evaluation of semester system for the purpose of certification of the students graduating in law-Bachelor of Law (LL.B. Three year) after completing the course as a regular student. The Principal (Controller of the Examinations) will submit the result of the evaluation to the Competent Authority of the University, the copies of the curriculum designed and developed in the course of study, rules of academic discipline and the examination and evaluation and also the amendments to those as and when so amended, for necessary action approval and notification will be submitted to the Academic Council.
- iii. The course leading to degree in law, shall be conducted in semester system including tutorials, moot room exercise, court visits & participations in Lok Adalat, free legal aid camps and seminars etc.

7. Course of Study-

A candidate for the three year LL.B. Degree course shall be required-

- i) To study six papers in each semester including clinical papers and must pass in all papers with minimum of 36% marks in each paper and 45% marks in aggregate in each semester in order to qualify for LL.B. Degree.
- ii) To study twenty five (25) compulsory theory papers, Four (04) optional theory papers out of twelve (12) optional theory papers from the allotted groups (Group-1 & Group-2) in Fifth and Sixth Semester and one paper of Legal Language- English (100Marks), carrying 100 marks for each paper through written examination conducted by the college. See 'as prescribed by the Bar Council of India Rules of Legal Education, 2008 Schedule II Part II' for the LL.B. Three Year Course'.
- iii) For the allotment of optional papers it shall be mandatory that minimum 30 % of the total students of that semester have opted the same optional papers, otherwise the student has to opt other optional papers.
- iv) To study four compulsory clinical papers as prescribed in IV to VI semesters carrying 100 marks for each paper through Project Work/ Practical Work and Viva-voce conducted by the College as prescribed by the Bar Council of India.
- v) Center of Legal Education (CLE) shall establish and run a legal Aid Clinic with the help of students and in co- operation with the Legal Aid Authorities.
- vi) Papers in LL.B. Three Year Course shall be Consist Thirty Four (34) papers including Twenty Six (26) compulsory papers, Four (04) Clinical Paper and Four (04) Papers from optional group 'as prescribed by the Bar Council of India Rules of

Legal Education, 2008 Schedule II Part II' for the LL.B. Three Year Course'. As annexed here in after Annexure B- Scheme of Papers.

- vii) The Contents of the Law papers/subject for LL.B. Degree Course shall be as Annexure- C of this Ordinance.

Examination

- viii) Any student who fails to secure 75% attendance in each paper will not be allowed to appear in examination. The aforesaid attendance requirement may be reduced up to 65% on recommendation of the Principal, on health ground or for any other reasonable cause.
- ix) There shall be an examination at the end of each semester of three years study programme. Every student registered in any semester shall be eligible to appear in the concerned examination of the respective semester, subject to the attendance requirement as prescribed by the Bar Council of India and the College/University (whichever applicable). It shall be calculated on the semester basis.
- x) The Candidate(s) for the three year degree course (Bachelor of Laws) shall be required to pass in all the prescribed courses within the span of six years from the academic session of his/her admission in First Semester.
- xi) A candidate shall be examined in 'Twenty Six (26) compulsory (including one 'Legal Language- English')' & 'Four (04) optional theory papers' from first to six semester carrying 100 marks for each paper through written examination duration of three hours conducted by the Institute.
- xii) The 'Four (4) Compulsory Clinical Paper' shall be examined as prescribed in contents of papers and student must be pass in clinical papers with minimum 45%(percent) of total marks.
- xiii) A Student must pass in all 34 Papers and in Legal Language-English with a minimum of 36% marks in each and 45% in aggregate in each semester in order to qualify for the LL.B. Degree.
- xiv) A student who appeared in the Ist Semester Examination shall be automatically promoted to IInd Semester, Similarly IIIrd to IVth, and Vth to VIth Semester as defined in the LL.B. (Three Year Course) Regulation. He will be allowed to appear as a back student according to para Vth to VIIIth of Entitled to Promotion under Point No-7.
- xv) There shall be an examination at the end of each semester.
- xvi) There shall be a viva-voce examination in Four practical/clinical papers excluding the 'Professional ethics & Professional Accounting System' which will be divided into sixty + forty respectively written & viva-voce examination.
- xvii) The student has to qualify both theory and practical examination.
- xviii) The student who obtained 45% marks but less than 60% marks will be placed in 2nd

(Second) division and those who obtains 60% and above will be placed in 1st (First division).

Rules of Promotion, Back Papers and Improvement.

For promotion in next semester/year to participate in college Examination the Student(s) are categorized as in followings:-

xix) The candidate(s), who have taken admission in *LL.B. First Semester* in a session can be put in the following two categories on the basis of their attendance in the session.

(i) Those who put the required minimum percentage of attendance for appearing in the First Semester Examination and filled in examination form in time for appearing in the first semester examination ;

(ii) Those who do not put the required minimum percentage of attendance for appearing in the First Semester Examination or do not filled in examination form in time for appearing in the first semester examination;

The candidates under category (i) are eligible for appearing in the examination of Part I, while candidates under category (ii) are not eligible to appear in the examination of semester.

Further candidates of category (ii) are not eligible for re-admission. The admission of those candidates will stand cancel.

xx) After appearing in the Examination of First semester the candidates can be put in the following Categories in the context of declaration of result of first Semester Examination.

(a) **Passed** i.e. who have passed in all items of the examination of the semester;

(b) **Promoted** i.e. who have not passes in all the items of the examination of semester.

i. The candidate(s), who appeared in *LL.B. First Semester Examination* in a session shall be promoted to the *LL.B. Second Semester* and allowed to appear in examination subject to condition above mentioned rule relating the attendance and fill up the in time examination form.

ii. Declaration of results after second Semester- After declaration of results of First & Second Semesters a candidates to participate in college Examination, the Student(s) and similarly the onwards i.e. third, fourth, fifth and sixth as mention hereinafter, are categorized as in followings:-

(a) **Passed** i.e. who have passed in all items of the examination of the semester.

(b) Entitled to Promotion 'EP'

(c) Eligible to Promotion on Back Paper 'EPBP'

(d) No Promotion, 'NP'

Entitled to Promotion (EP)

- i) A student(s) of First and Second semester shall be promoted in Third semester if he/she has passed the First and Second; and a student(s) has passed the First, Second, Third and Fourth Semesters shall be promoted in the Fifth Semester.
- ii) A student of first and second semester shall be promoted in third semester if he/she has secured 36% marks in each paper and 45% marks in aggregate in each semester.
- iii) Similarly a student of Third and Fourth semester shall be promoted in Fifth semester if he/she has secured 36% marks in each paper and 45% marks in aggregate in each semester and has been cleared and passed the First and Second Semesters exams.
- iv) A student enrolled in *First* semester and have appeared in the semester exam shall be promoted in *Second* semester and student enrolled in *Third* semester appeared in the semester exam shall be promoted to *Fourth* semester, similarly a student enrolled in *Fifth* Semester and have appeared in the semester exam shall be promoted to *Sixth* semester.

Eligibility for Promotion on Back Paper 'EPBP'

- v) A student(s) who has secured minimum marks of 36% in each paper, but failed to secure aggregate of 45% will be allowed to appear in back paper examination held in the next year as according to para -vi, vii, viii & ix.
- vi) A student(s) would be Eligible to Promotion on Back Paper 'EPBP' may be enrolled and promoted in the Third Semester, if he/she secured the 45% marks in minimum seven papers of First and Second semesters exams; allowed to appear in back paper examination.
- vii) A student(s) would be Eligible to Promotion on Back Paper 'EPBP' may be enrolled and promoted in the Fifth Semester, if he/she secured the 45% marks in minimum seven papers of Third & Fourth semesters exams and had been cleared the First & Second semesters exams; allowed to appear in back paper examination.
- viii) A student(s) who has secured more than 36% marks paper but not secured 45% aggregate, he shall be eligible to appear in back paper.
- ix) A student who has failed in semester exam shall be eligible to appear in back paper examination.
- x) A Student who has not cleared his/her back paper exam with regular semester exams, he/she will be treated as Year Back and shall be eligible to appear in back paper examination in the prescribed duration period of the course.

No Promotion 'NP'

- xi) No Promotion, 'NP' - No student(s) shall be promoted to next semester if he/she has been detained in the examination for shortage of attendance.
- xii) No Promotion, 'NP' - A student(s), who has not appeared or failed to appeared in the Semesters Exam-First, Third & Fifth shall not be promoted in Second, Fourth & Sixth Semesters respectively.
- xiii) No Promotion, 'NP' - A student(s) would not be promoted in Fifth Semester, if he/she, has not passed the Semesters Exam-First and Second both.

- xiv) Improvement examination of LL.B. I to VI semester will be held as per college rules.

8. Re-admission Rules

- i. There shall be no re-admission in the LL.B. First, Third and Fifth semester
- ii. A student who has failed in examination or failed to appear in the examination and who is otherwise eligible to appear in the examination as an ex-student shall not be admitted as a regular student.

9. Overriding Effect:

The relevant UGC/BCI Rules (as amended from time to time) shall be binding on the college. All disputes regarding interpretation of provisions of this Ordinance shall be referred to 'Examination Committee of College', whose decision shall be final.

In context to above '*the Committee*' shall be constituted with Principal of the Institute, Head/In charge of Law Department and a Senior Faculty member.

10. Miscellaneous Provisions

- i. The rules contained herein the 'Ordinance' shall be deemed to have come into effect from the academic session 2025-2026 to the extent of its applicability.
- ii. Any provision contained in earlier ordinances in this regard repugnant to the present ordinances shall stand repealed.
- iii. Nothing in this ordinance shall be deemed or affect the inherent powers of the Principal of the Institute to make such orders, circulars as may be necessary to give the effect to regularize the academic sessions or in the interest of the college.

**Course outline of the Legal Education prescribed by the Bar Council of India for
Bachelor Degree in Law (LL.B. 3year)**

Compulsory subjects in legal education component in both the streams (Paper 1 to 20)
Institute/Center of Legal Education is free to design any subject in one or more than one papers where more papers are not stipulated:

1. Jurisprudence (Legal method, Indian legal system, and basic theory of law).
2. Law of Contract
3. Special Contract
4. Law of Tort including MV Accident and Consumer Protection Laws
5. & 6. Family Law (2 papers)
7. Law of Crimes Paper I : Penal Code
8. Law of Crime Paper II : Criminal Procedure Code
9. & 10. Constitutional Law (two papers)
11. Property Law
12. Law of Evidence
13. Civil Procedure Code and Limitation Act
14. Administrative Law
15. Company Law
16. Public International Law
17. Principles of Taxation Law
18. Environmental Law
19. & 20. Labour and Industrial Law (2papers)

Part II (B) Compulsory Clinical Courses (Papers 21 to 24 as following):

21. Drafting, Pleading and Conveyance Outline of the course:

- (a) Drafting: -General principles of drafting and relevant substantive rules shall be taught
- (b) Pleadings: (i) Civil: Plaint ,Written Statement, Interlocutory Application ,Original Petition, Affidavit, Execution Petition, Memorandum of Appeal and Revision, Petition under Article 226 and 32 of the Constitution of India.
- (ii) Criminal: Complaint, Criminal Miscellaneous petition, Bail Application, Memorandum of Appeal and Revision.
- (iii) Conveyance: Sale Deed, Mortgage Deed, Lease Deed, Gift Deed, Promissory Note, Power of Attorney, Will, Trust Deed
- (iv) Drafting of writ petition and PIL petition the course will be taught class instructions and simulation exercises, preferably with assistance of practicing lawyers/retired judges. Apart from teaching the relevant provisions of law, the course may include not less than 15 practical exercises in drafting carrying a total of 45 marks (3 marks for each) and 15 exercises in conveyancing carrying another 45 marks (3 marks for each exercise) remaining 10 marks will be given for viva voce.

22. Professional Ethics & Professional Accounting system Outline of the course: Professional Ethics, Accountancy for Lawyers and Bar-Bench Relations This course will be taught in association with practicing lawyers on the basis of the following materials. (i) Mr. Krishnamurthy Iyer's book on "Advocacy" (ii) The Contempt Law and Practice (iii) The Bar Council Code of Ethics (iv) 50 selected opinions of the Disciplinary Committees of Bar Councils and 10 major judgments of the Supreme Court on the subject (v) Other reading materials as may be prescribed by the University Examination rules of the University shall include assessment through case-study, viva, and periodical problem solution besides the written tests.

23. Alternate Dispute Resolution:

Outline of the course:

- (i) Negotiation skills to be learned with simulated program
- (j) Conciliation skills
- (k) Arbitration Law and Practice including International arbitration and Arbitration rules.

The course is required to be conducted by senior legal practitioners through simulation and case studies. Evaluation may also be conducted in practical exercises at least for a significant part of evaluation.

24. Moot court exercise and Internship:

This paper may have three components of 30 marks each and a viva for 10 marks.

- (a) Moot Court (30 Marks). Every student may be required to do at least three moot courts in a year with 10 marks for each. The moot court work will be on assigned problem and it will be evaluated for 5 marks for written submissions and 5 marks for oral advocacy.
- (b) Observance of Trial in two cases, one Civil and one Criminal (30 marks): Students may be required to attend two trials in the course of the last two or three years of LL.B. studies. They will maintain a record and enter the various steps observed during their attendance on different days in the court assignment. This scheme will carry 30 marks.
- (c) Interviewing techniques and Pre-trial preparations and Internship diary (30 marks): Each student will observe two interviewing sessions of clients at the Lawyer's Office/Legal Aid Office and record the proceedings in a diary, which will carry 15 marks. Each student will further observe the preparation of documents and court papers by the Advocate and the procedure for the filing of the suit/petition. This will be recorded in the diary, which will carry 15 marks.
- (d) The fourth component of this paper will be Viva Voce examination on all the above three aspects. This will carry 10 marks.





Law Three-Year Course: LL.B. Program

Regulations

1. For admission to the first semester of the LL.B. (Three-Year Course), the minimum qualification required for the candidate is to pass the graduation or an equivalent examination recognized by any educational institution/University operated by the central or state government with a minimum of 45% marks for General, 42% marks for OBC* (As per the Gazette of India REGD.NO.D.L.33004/99 DATED 07.08.2014 PART III SECTION 4, NO.233), and 40% marks for SC/ST respectively.
2. There is no age limit criterion for the admission in the LL.B. Program. The Candidate must pass the Graduation examination with the minimum percentage of prescribed category in point No-1.
3. There shall be semester system for the examination as per the Rules of Legal Education, 2008 provided by the Bar Council of India. Therefore, there will be two semester examinations conducted by the autonomous college for each year. Accordingly, the entire three-year course will be divided into six semesters. It is mandatory to obtain a minimum of 36% marks in every examination papers of each semester; however, students will only be considered to have passed if their total marks across all question papers in each semester add up to 45%.
4. All students enrolled in the first semester will automatically be promoted to the second semester. However, admission to the third semester will only be granted if they have passed both the first and second semesters or have obtained at least 45 % (percent) marks in seven (07) out of a total of twelve question papers from the first and second semesters. Students participating in the third semester examination will be automatically promoted to the fourth semester.
5. For admission to the fifth semester, it will be necessary for the student to completely passed the examinations of first and second semester and in the condition of incomplete result in third and fourth semester it is compulsory to have at least 45 % (percent) marks in Seven (07) out of a total of twelve question papers in the third and



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fourth semester. Students appearing for the fifth semester examination will be automatically promoted to the sixth semester and a student will be eligible to receive the degree of LL.B. (Three-Year Course) only after passing the examinations of all previous semesters, including the sixth semester.

6. Student who passes all six semesters will be awarded the LL.B. degree by affiliating University.
7. Students who do not have a total of 45 percent marks in all papers of any semester will be required to reappear for those papers in which they have obtained less than 36 percent marks to pass the exam. However, if they wish, they can also reappear in those papers in which they have obtained more than 36 percent marks to achieve a total of 45 percent marks. Such re-examinations will be conducted along with the main semester examinations organized by the autonomous college. Students participating in re-examinations must submit an examination application form to the autonomous college and pay the prescribed fee.
8. The minimum marks for second division will be 45 % (percent), and for first division, it will be 60 % (percent).
9. It will be necessary for students admitted to the first semester of the LL.B. (Three-Year Course) to complete all six semesters within a maximum period of 06 (Six) years; otherwise, they will not be able to obtain the degree of LL.B. (Three-Year Course).
